Azithromycin given to women in labour may decrease ocular bacterial infection in neonates.

- Vertical transmission can result in neonatal infections. Reducing transmission of bacterial pathogens from mother to infant may be an effective means of preventing neonatal infection, including bacterial conjunctivitis.
- In a double-blind trial in 843 infants, it was observed that administration of a single dose of oral azithromycin to women in labour reduced the incidence of purulent neonatal conjunctivitis.
- The incidence of gram-positive bacterial colonization in the conjunctiva was also lower in the azithromycin group.

Oral azithromycin given to women during labour may reduce incidence of bacterial neonatal conjunctivitis.
